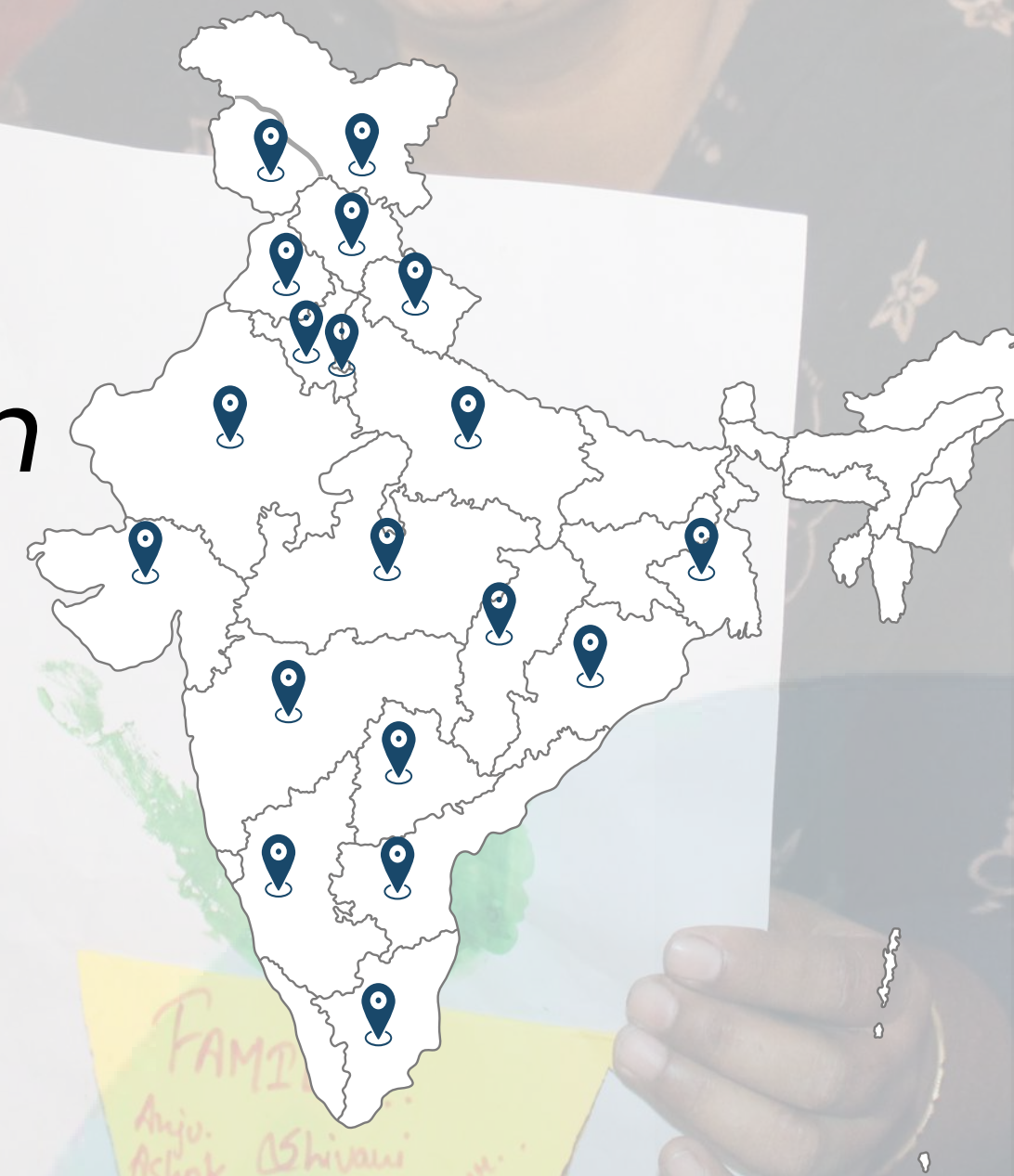

WHY RESILIENT GROWTH?

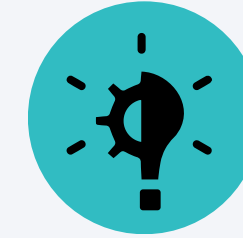

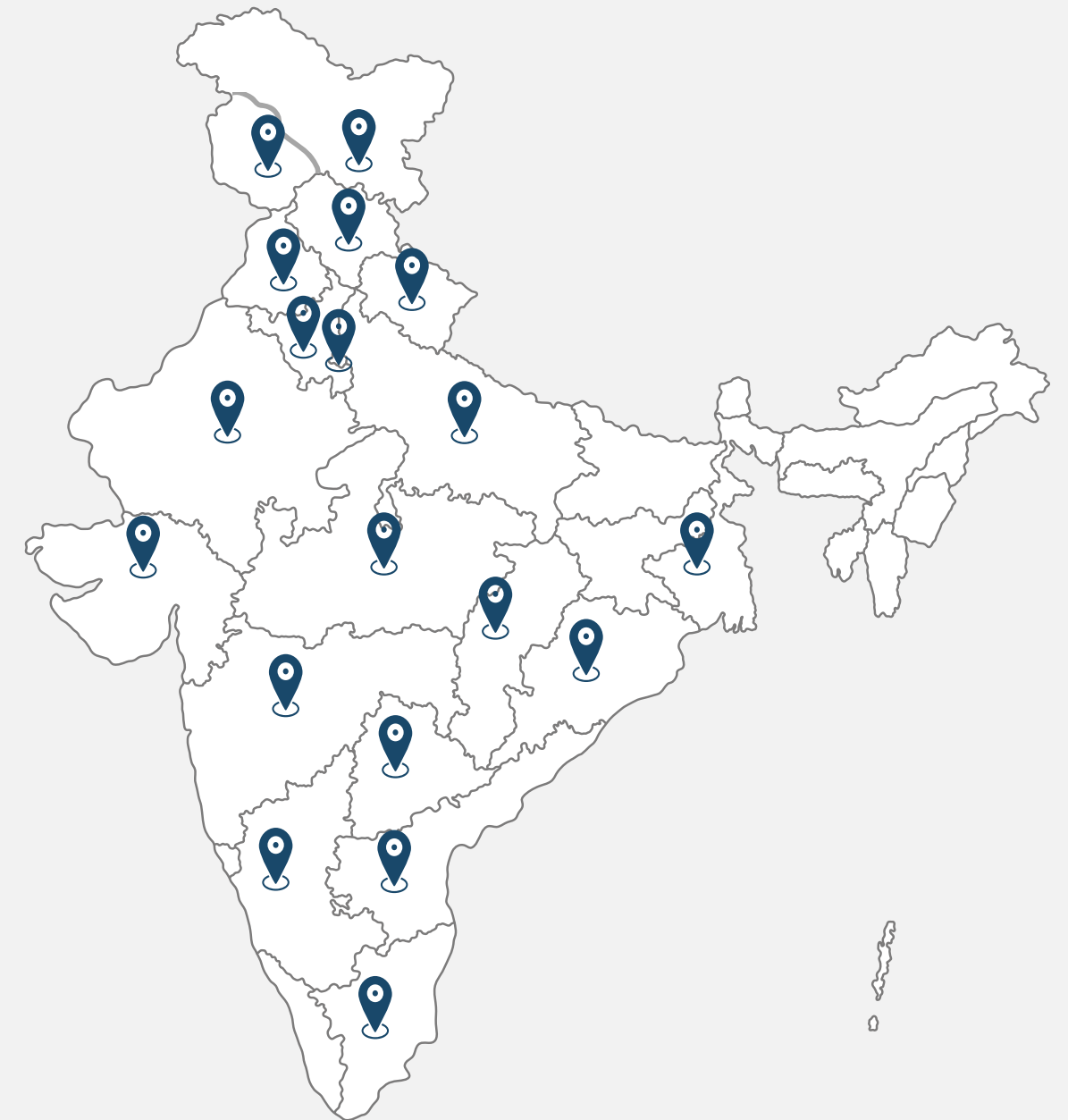

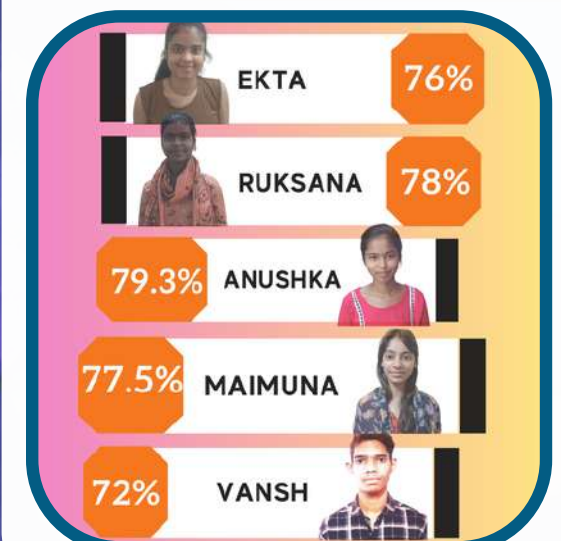

The 4s stands for “Skill”, “Shiksha”, “Sanskar” and “Swasth” Combined with other therapeutic approaches (art, music & dance), life skills training, sporting events, and festival celebrations.

NEW INITIATIVES



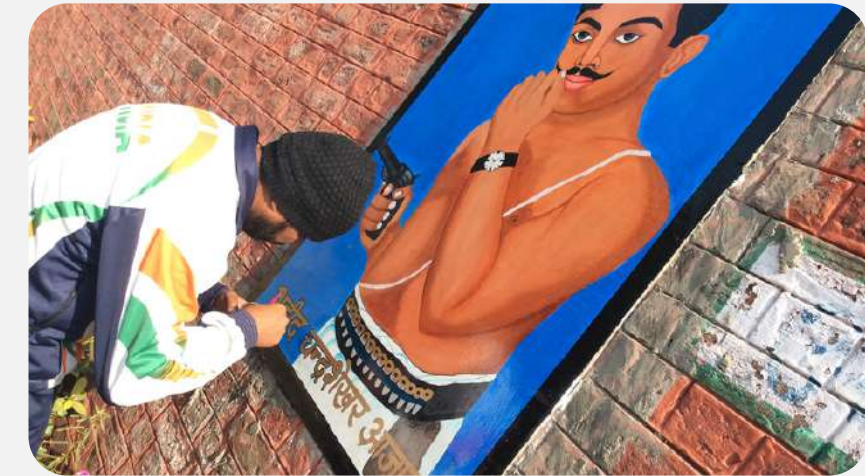
RADIO PARVAZ

As Radio Parvaz's reach continues to grow, we were delighted to extend the initiative to numerous additional locations. In 2022, we successfully launched the Prison Radio at Dasna Prison in Ghaziabad, marking a significant milestone in our efforts.



KHUSHALI

Project Khushali is an initiative aimed at poverty alleviation and reducing recidivism by imparting vocational and life skills to prison inmates. Project Khushali aims to enhance the holistic well-being of the inmates of Gurugram Prison by imparting therapeutic skills in Gardening, Nursery management & Organic farming and empowering them for a self-reliant life upon release through skills for livelihood.



SABRANG

Project Sabrang is a therapeutic intervention with prison inmates through the medium of art. Keeping this very need in mind, along with the importance of the 'skill' aspect from the 4S model of India Vision Foundation, Project Sabrang was born to inculcate painting and art as a skill along with hope and hard work among the inmates.



Early Childhood Care and Development Program

India Vision Foundation is running Creche inside Prison under its Early Childhood Care & Development (ECCD) Program which aims to engage with children of prison inmates by enrolling them in the inside prison day-care center, facilitating elementary education & holistic development through play-way methods. A clever mix of education, games, painting, music, and dance adds to the fun element of the learning process.

Children of Vulnerable Families Program

After the age of six, the program aims to mainstream and educate the children of incarcerated families, ensure their overall development through various interventions to help them achieve their academic, social, and emotional goals, and prevent them from becoming a victim of their parental incarceration.

Children of incarcerated parents face a number of clear difficulties that impede their overall development. These difficulties include financial strain brought on by the imprisonment of one or both family income-earners, social stigma, vulnerability to crime and exploitation, interruption of formal education, trauma-induced reactions to taking on parental responsibilities, etc.

Training of Prison Officials Program

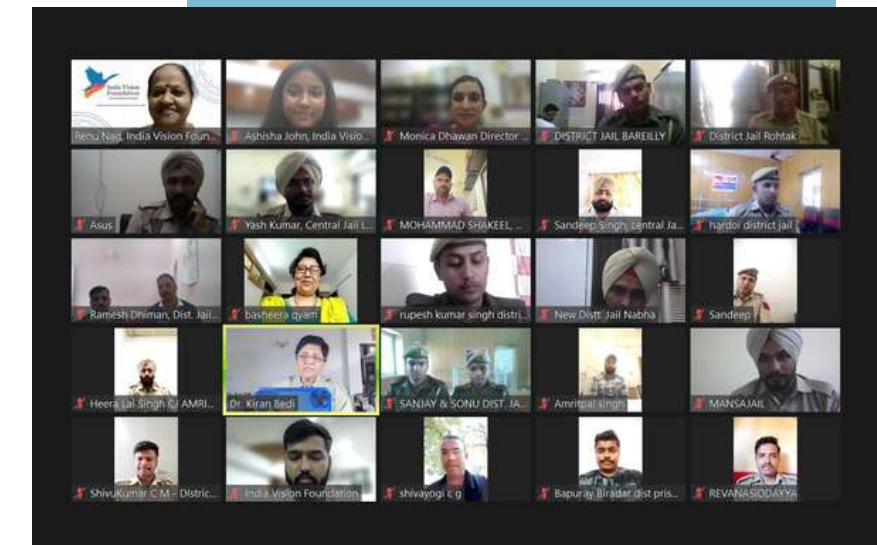
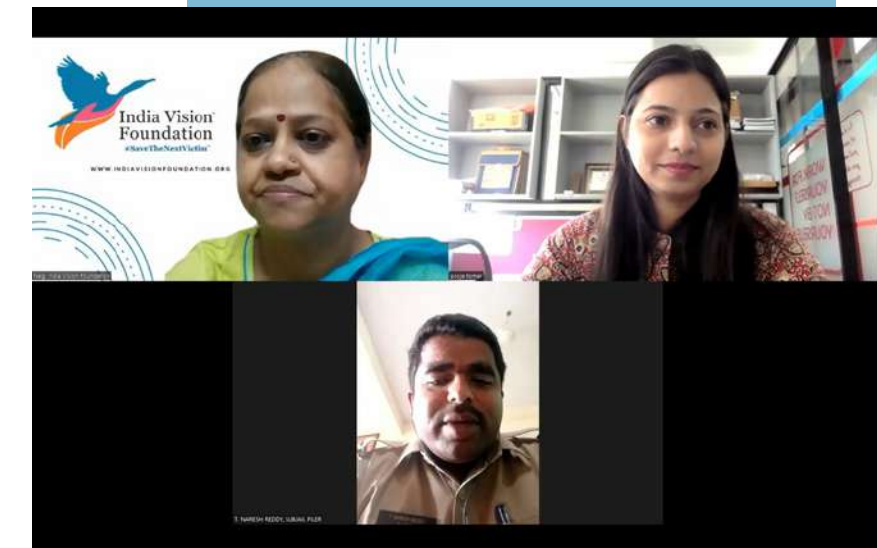

SAMVAD

SAMVAD Training Program aimed to provide insights into the critical role of Prison Warders in managing a Prison and enhancing their capacities. Also, the program offered a platform for the trainees to share the best practices in their respective prisons and discuss challenges for better work-life balance.

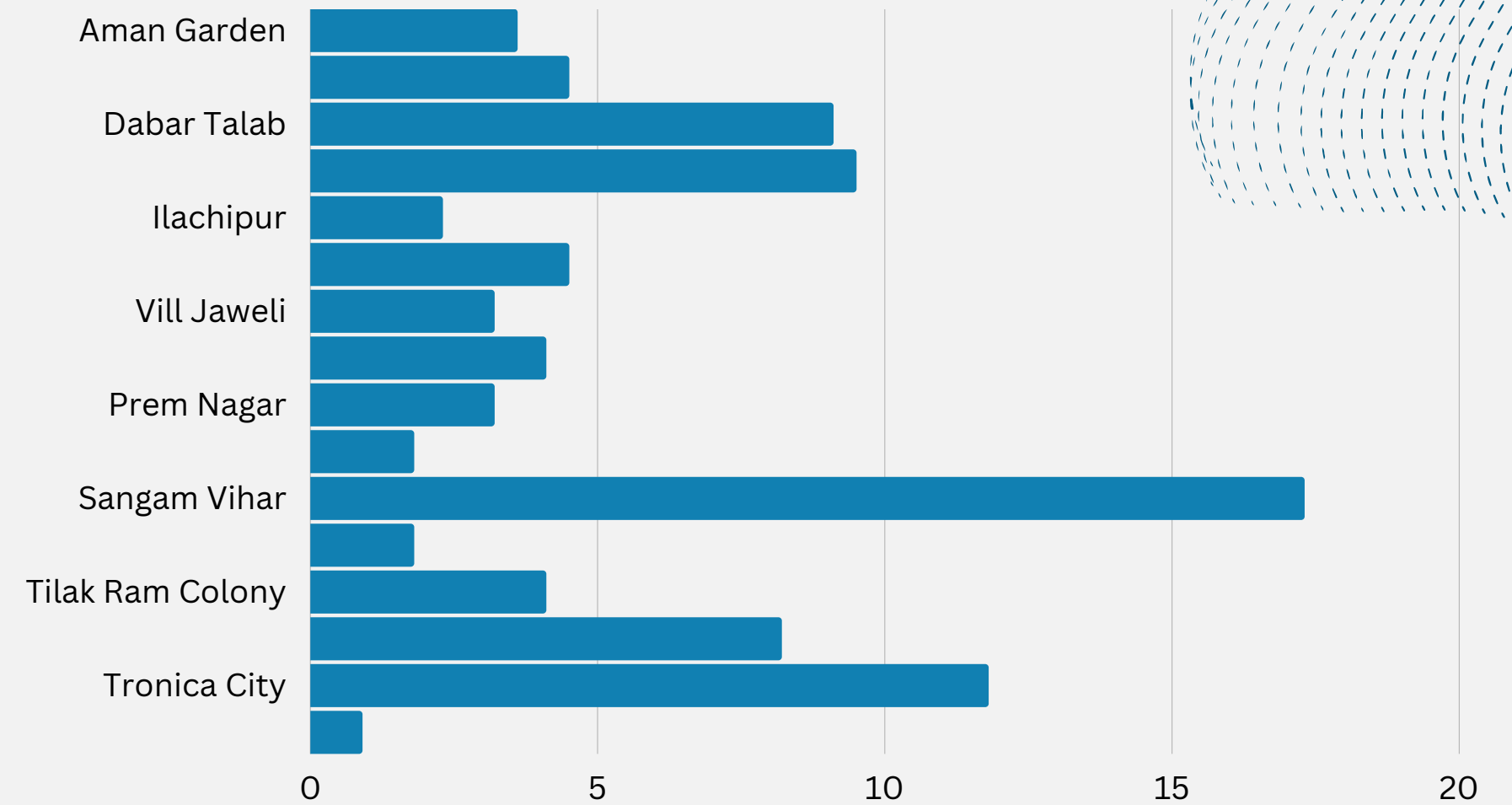

PILOT PROJECT (LONI)



Loni is a Nagar Palika Parishad city in district of Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh. The population of Loni in 2022 is estimated to be 3,118. According to the 2011 census, the population was 2,728. Divided into 45 wards, for which elections are held every 5 years, the crime index in Loni according to the latest reports in March 2022 has gone up to 59.89 percent, leaving a 40.11 percent of space for safety index. The level of crime has increased by 61.82 percent in the past 3 years, with a total rate of 70.19 percent in level of crime.

In order to implement need-based interventions for released inmates and the families of prisoners who are currently inside prison, the Survey attempts to identify the needs of the community. The Baseline survey was conducted with 363 community members belonging to 55 families, including 27 families of the released beneficiaries and 28 families of the inside prison inmates. Out of the total community members surveyed, it was found that 143 were children. The family size in the community was found to be very small, having either one or two family members. Project Hope aspires to follow a comprehensive intervention strategy of Access – Aware – Enable – Influence to facilitate holistic wellbeing, including socio-economic and psychological empowerment of those affected by imprisonment through prison community-based outreach & action plan for a safe, just, and resilient society.

इंडिया विजन फाउंडेशन एनजीओ की डायरेक्टर मोनिका धवन ने बताया कि जिन 6 वर्ष या इससे अधिक उम्र के बच्चों के माता-पिता जेल में बंद हैं, उनका जिम्मा भी एनजीओ ने उठा रखा है। ऐसे करीब 2 हजार बच्चों का डेटा जुटाया है, जोकि दिल्ली, हरियाणा व उत्तर प्रदेश के रहने वाले हैं। 12 साल तक देखभाल व पढ़ाई के बाद 150 बच्चे वर्तमान में विभिन्न क्षेत्रों में काम कर रहे हैं। अभी 250 बच्चे मुकाम हासिल करने की ओर अग्रसर हैं। एनजीओ के प्रयासों से जेलों में महिला बंदियों के साथ रहने वाले छोटे



दो बंदी ऐसे, जो एनजीओ से जुड़ बंदियों को दे रहे सही दिशा

एनजीओ की डायरेक्टर मोनिका धवन ने बताया कि बंदियों को कैसे तो जेल से बाहर निकलने पर नौकरी मिलना मुश्किल हो जाता है। इसलिए बंदियों को सिलाई-कढ़ाई, पेंटिंग, कंप्यूटर, हेयर कटिंग, संगीत, योगा तक सीखा रहे हैं, ताकि जेल से बाहर निकलकर वे खुद का काम शुरू कर सकें। इस कड़ी

में हरियाणा की जेलों से बाहर आकर 90 बंदियों ने खुद का रोजगार शुरू किया है या फिर किसी कंपनी में नौकरी करके समाज में सम्मान के साथ जी रहे हैं। 2 बंदी ऐसे थे, जो एनजीओ से जुड़कर बतौर प्रोजेक्ट कोऑर्डिनेटर व ऑफिस मैनेजर बनकर अन्य बंदियों को सही दिशा दिखा रहे हैं।

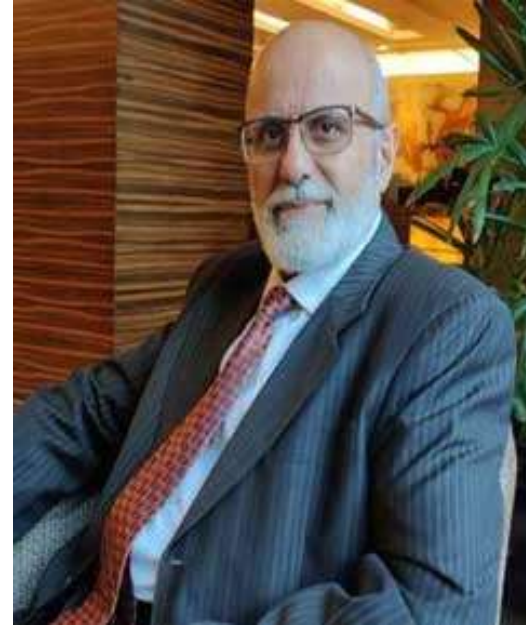

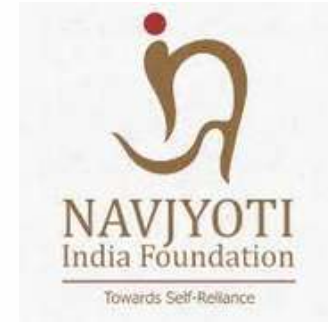

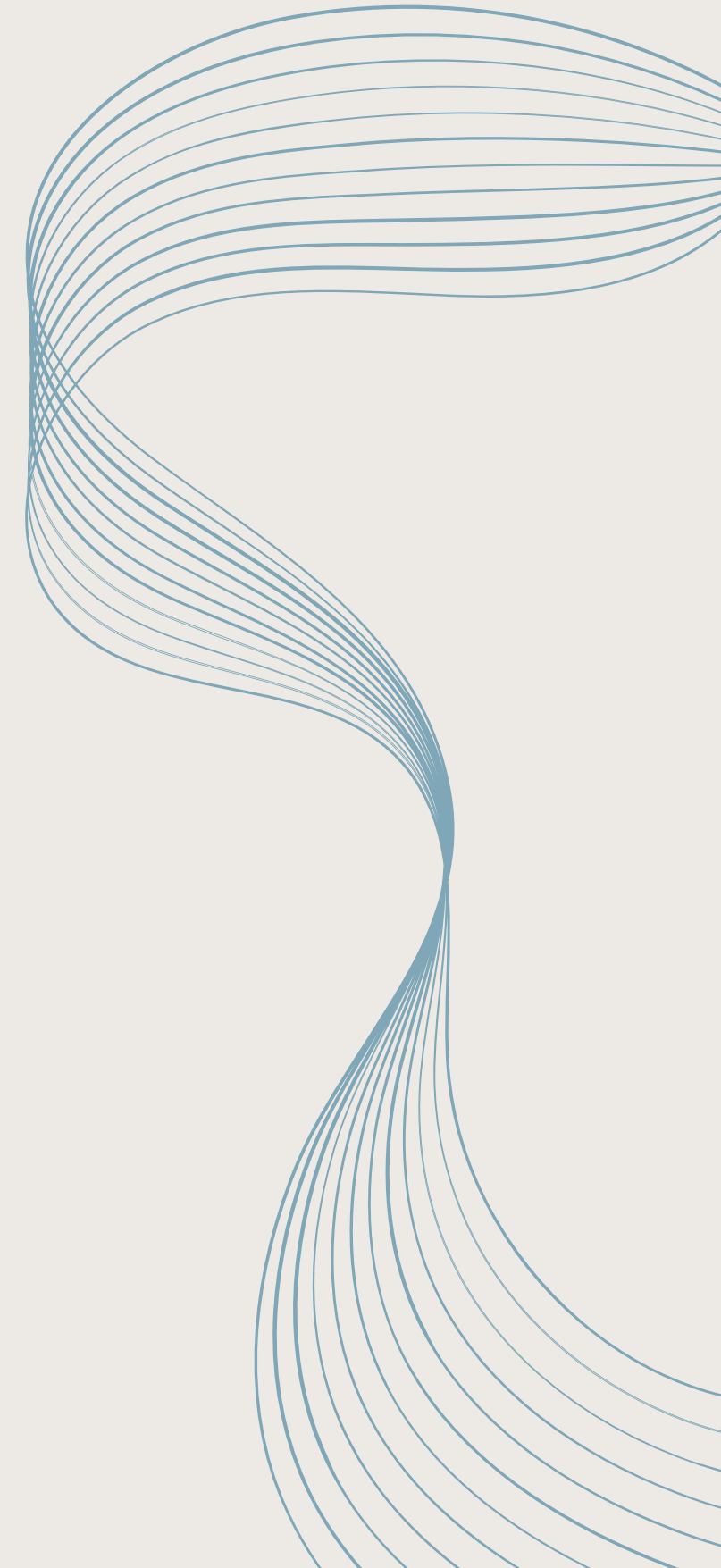
